### 29th Assembly of the Northern Illinois Synod Elects New Bishop

The assembly was held June 16th—18th this year. Pastor TroyAnn, Karen Van Howe and Kathly Wright attended from Emmanuel.

As Bishop Wollersheim is retiring this year, the main item on the agenda was electing a new Bishop. There were 68 candidates nominated on the first ballot. After the first ballot, the top 15 candidates had to fill out a biographical profile or were asked to fill out a withdrawal if they did not wish to continue. The biographies were passed out and a second vote was held. After the second ballot, a more detailed questionnaire had to be filled out by the top eight candidates (there should have been seven but two candidates had tied) and passed out. Each of these 8 candidates then had to give a 5 minute speech on any topic they chose. Then a third ballot was cast by the assembly. After the third ballot, there were three candidates left. Each of these three candidates were asked the same six prepared questions. After the fourth ballot and there was no one with a 60% majority, the number of candidates was down to two: Rev. Jeffrey Clements (who is part of Bishop Wollersheim's clerical staff in the Synod Office) and Rev. Stacie Fidlar (who is Pastor of St John's Lutheran in Rock Island, IL) On the fifth vote, a majority of votes were required.

Rev. Jeffrey Clements received the majority of those votes and will become our new Bishop in September.

The new Northern IL Synod Bishop's installation service will be held Saturday, September 24th at 10:00 am at First Lutheran Church in Rockford, IL.
